- Name: Association of Handmaids of Allah.
- First President Hazrat Amma Jan

### **Introduction in Ghana**

- Introduced in 1930 by Alhaji Hakeem Fazlur Rahman Sahib
- Organized further during 1933–1935 by Nazeer Ahmad Ali Sahib.
- Early focus on education and training of women.



- 1944: Opening of the first women's school in Gold **Coast**
- 1952: Kumasi Ashanti Region **Council was formalized**
- 1957: First annual meeting held in Salt Pond.
- Foundation of Lajna Hall in **Techiman**
