RELIGION

What is the Holy Quran?

The Holy Quran is a compilation of the verbal revelations given to the Holy Prophet^{sa} over a period of twenty three years.

What is Islam?

The word 'Islam' literally means 'Peace and surrender to the will of Allah the Creator'. It was founded by Prophet Muhammad (sa) over 1400 years ago in Arabia.

What is Sunnah?

Sunnah is the practical example of the Holy Prophet^{sa} to demonstrate Quranic principles.

What is Hadith?

Hadith is an Arabic word (its plural is Ahadith). Hadith means (i) the words actually spoken by the Holy Prophet^{sa}, or (ii) words that describe an observed incident related to the Life of the Holy Prophet^{sa}.

RELIGION

What is the purpose of religion?

The purpose of religion is to worship which helps to achieve nearness to Allah and lead a peaceful life.

The purpose common to the advent of all the Prophets, on whom be peace, is to establish true and real love of God

Why do we pray?

Prayer is the most basic form of communication between human beings and God.


There are five daily Prayers, each of which should be performed at its own appointed time.


The Holy Quran is the word of God sent to help guide us through our whole life and help us make the best decisions

When it's hot in summer can I wear shorts?

Huzoor^{aba} explained in a Gulshane Waqfe Nau class: "When you are five or six years old, you should not wear dresses without leggings. Your legs should be covered. So that you gradually realise that, your clothes should cover you. Do not wear sleeveless dresses." Why do some of my Muslim friends wear a headscarf?

His Holiness^{aba} said that those who observed Purdah would be greatly rewarded by God. "Purdah and Hijab actually establish the true dignity, independence and freedom of women. Hijab does not only give women physical security but is also a key means of giving them spiritual security and purity of heart."

Why does my mum wear a burqah?

Huzoor^{aba} explained at a Jalsa Salana address: "An Ahmadi woman and an Ahmadi girl, who has reached the age of purdah, must always remember that purdah is a part of her faith. This is one of the commandments of the Holy Qur'an. With the grace of Allah, most young Ahmadi women understand this reality." At what age should we wear a head scarf?

Huzoor^{aba} explained in a Gulshane Waqfe Nau class: "Each girl should consider, if she looks older then she should wear a scarf. If you make a habit of wearing the scarf at a young age, then you will not be selfconscious of it... The true purpose of 'Purdah' is modesty. You should be modest... The respect of an Ahmadi girl and woman is in maintaining her modesty. Modesty is the real thing. This modesty should stop others from seeing you in bad way."

Why do we have to pray so much?

We pray 5 times a day so we can keep talking to Allah. We can ask Him for anything we want, He helps us in everything we do so we have to make sure we keep a strong connection with Him all day, everyday. It is also important to remember that we eat several times a day to keep our body healthy. Similarly, by praying 5 times a day we are able to keep our mind and soul healthy.

What is Namaz?

Namaz or Salat, are the 5 daily prayers prescribed for all Muslims. It is also the second pillar of Islam, showing how important it is for every Muslim.

Can we combine prayers?

Salat was given to us as 5 separate daily prayers, so it is important to pray and remember Allah 5 times a day.
However, sometimes it is permissible to pray Zohar and Asr or Maghrib and Isha together. For example, if you are going on a long journey and you will not reach your destination before the next prayer time, it is best to combine prayers.

Can I do Tayamum instead of Wudhu?

Tayamum is only permitted if there is no clean water available. If you have access to water you should always do Wudhu. Why do I have to do Wudhu before Salat, if I'm already clean?

Wudhu is important because it prepares us for Salat. Allah has asked us in the Quran to perform Wudhu before each Namaz so that we are refreshed and clean and can start our prayers with a clear mind. Furthermore, Wudhu is considered to be the preparation step for Salat.

What can break my Wudhu and what if my wudhu breaks in Salat?

There are a number of things that can break your wudhu including passing wind, vomiting, bleeding and sleeping, just to name a few. That's why its important to refresh your Wudhu before each prayer. If any of these things happen during namaz, you should redo your wudhu before continuing.

Who is Hazrat Muhammad (sa)?

The Holy Prophet Muhammad (sa) was the founder prophet of Islam and the one to whom the final religion was revealed by Allah. He was born in a noble family in 570 CE in Makkah, Arabia and he was a descendant of Prophet Abraham^{as}. The word 'Muhammad' literally means 'praiseworthy'.

Allah had to send so many different Prophets to help all the different people in all moments of time. There are so many people around the world and the world has existed for so long. So to help everyone there had to be lots of prophets sent down.

Similarly, Hazrat Yaqub^{as} is known as Jacob and Hazrat Yusuf^{as} is Joseph in English!

What is a Prophet?

A prophet is a person chosen by Allah for the reformation and guidance of mankind. Islam makes it compulsory for every Muslim to believe not just in the truth of the Prophet Muhammad (sa), but also to believe in the truth of all the other prophets in the world that came before him.



He also spends his time replying to letters from all around the world. On some days, Huzoor^{aba} also does mulaqat with people. What is Eid? Eid is the name of the celebrations we have, as Muslims. We have 2 different Eid celebrations each year; Eid Ul Fitr and Eid Ul Adha.

EID UL ADHA

Why do we celebrate Eid twice a year? Each year, we have 2 Eid celebrations and both are celebrated for different reasons. Eid UI Fitr is celebrated to mark the end of Ramadhan and a whole month of fasting. Eid UI Adha is celebrated to honour the sacrifice of Hazrat Ibrahim (as).

Eid is celebrated according to the lunar calendar. This means that the months in the Islamic calendar, change as the moon changes. In all the countries around the world the moon is seen differently, so depending on which country you are in, the day of Eid changes.


Some facts about Eid!

Eid Ul Fitr means "Festival of breaking the fast"
Eid Ul Adha means "Festival of Sacrifice"
Eid goes back approximately 10 days every year. This means it takes about 38 years for Eid to be around the same date again!

Are there any special ceremonies around the birth of a baby? When a Muslim child is born, the first ceremony to be performed is to recite "Adhan" and "Iqamah" in the ears of the new born. This can be performed by anyone and is usually whispered into the ears of the baby.

Usually on the seventh day after the birth of the baby an animal is sacrificed and a feast follows wherein friends, relatives and neighbours are invited and some of the sacrificial meat is distributed among the poor. The animal sacrificed can be a goat, sheep, lamb, cow or camel.

Can I celebrate my birthday?





Why can't I eat the same food as the rest of my friends?

There are some food that Allah has asked us, as Muslims, not to eat. Meat from pigs, including bacon and ham are haram for Muslims to eat, as mentioned in the Holy Quran. Therefore, some of your non-Muslim friends might eat these things, but you should always avoid food that are not Halal.

Why am I not allowed to eat sweets that contain gelatine?

CHOO

Huzoor^{aba} once explained: "With regards to gelatine, it is made with different things. Alright? Some are made with animal bones. Including swine's bones, it is displayed so on some labels as well. There are some vegetable gelatine, which are made from plants like aloe vera, and then there are types plants too. For example there are gelatine made of beans too. So these kind of types are halal. For those who have it written and usually they do write on the label that it contains traces of pig, do not eat that... Now they write 'alcohol-free chocolates' and 'vegetarian' chocolates on the chocolate boxes. So that type of gelatine you can eat."


